

Telling Times

To tell times in Japanese, we add "U/ji" after each clock time.





How to read minutes

It may be too complicated for beginners to memorize all minutes' readings. They depend on numbers and all are mixed up between "&\(\subset / \text{fun}" \) and "\(\subset \text{\(\subset} \) pun", therefore, we just sort them into 2 groups for each way as follows for now.

Minutes end with 5

ふん/fun

5 ふん/go fun

15 ふん/go fun

25 ふん/go fun

35 ふん/go fun

45 ふん/go fun

55 ふん/go fun

Minutes end with 0

ぷん/(p)pun

10 ぷん/juppun

20 ぷん/nijuppun

30 ぷん/sanjuppun

40 ぷん/yonjuppun

50 ぷん/gojuppun
